

Boy Scouts of America Wilderness First Aid Course



Based on the Boy Scouts of America's 16-hour Wilderness First Aid Curriculum, this course is offered through the Emergency Care and Safety Institute's Istrouma Area Council Educational Center and supported by the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, the American College of Emergency Room Physicians, and the Wilderness Medical Society. This course meets BSA Health & Safety requirements for participating in high adventure activities.

Course prerequisites: Minimum age 14 years; current certification in an adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course; completion of automatic external defibrillator (AED) training.

You must submit a copy of your current CPR and AED training at check in to attend and receive your BSA WFA completion card.
